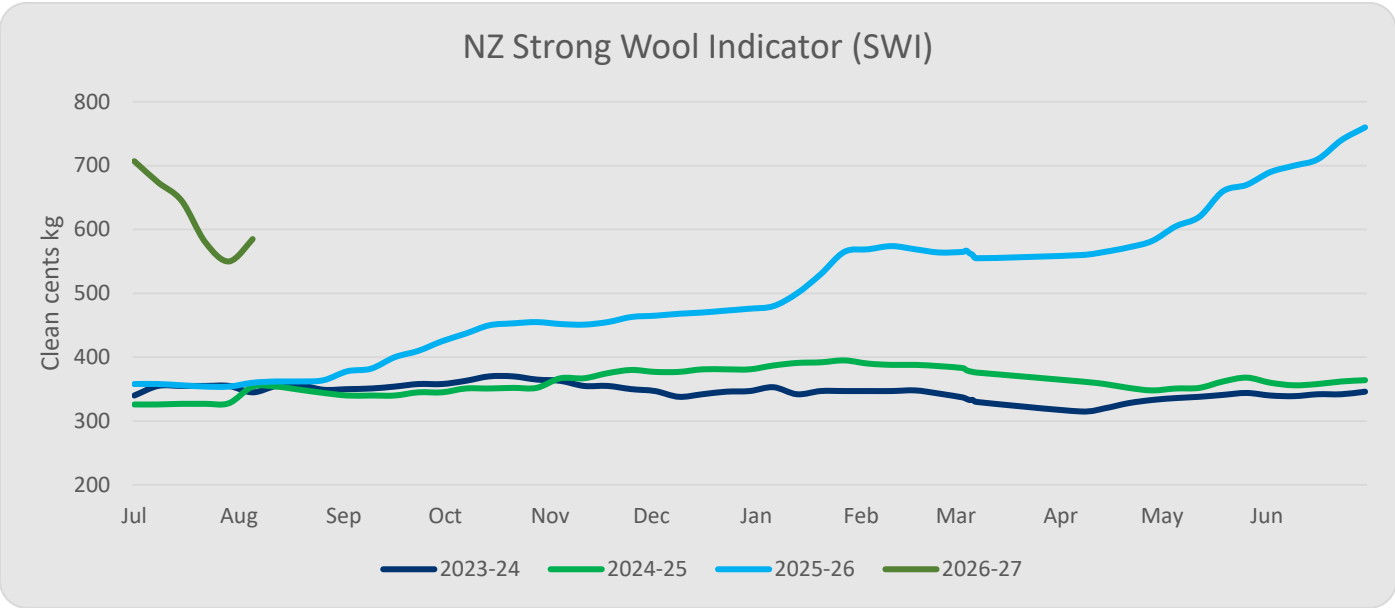

“ The market delivered a major reversal of the sharp downward spiral evident across recent sales, with renewed competition driving broad-based gains across the strong wool offering. Limited volumes coming forward for sale have prompted overseas buyers to underwrite new business, adding further momentum to the recovery. Crossbred second shear recorded the strongest lift, increasing 10–11%, while oddments rose 16%. Crossbred fleece was more measured, with good style up 4%, inferior style up 1%, and average style unchanged. Mid-micron fleece also improved selectively by 1–4%.

The stronger tone was supported by a passed-in rate of 9%, indicating improved alignment between buyer demand and grower expectations. While the recovery was not uniform across every category, the overall result provides a more positive outcome. Further volatility may be likely over the coming sales before the market settles into a more stable pattern.- Dave Burridge, National Auction Manager
